Instructions for Requesting Informed Consent/Assent from Minor (under 18 years of Age)

- 1. Before the child signs the form, please:
 - a. Explain the project to the child
 - b. Inform them that they may skip any interview question or stop participating at any time.
 - c. Retain some record that the student agreed to participate in addition to his/her parent's permission (a copy of each signed form for the school/organization as well as the child's parent to keep)
- 2. At the time of the interview, verbally remind the child of a. and b. above and ask for verbal confirmation before proceeding (This can be on the tape recording of the interview, requested of the child by the StoryWorks facilitator before the interview begins.)
