State Convention, May 15-17. The members will be able to tour the Ringling Brothers Circus Museum in Baraboo. WI.


The members will learn what GFWC-WI club has won monetarily in the News Letter contest. They will also learn which club has installed the most new members.





### GFWC Leadership - Preparing for Nominations and Elections

As clubs engage in electing new officers for the coming year or administration, presiding officers need to be prepared to either call for or manage nominations whether coming from a committee or from the floor. Before beginning, review the club's bylaws and standing rules and prepare a script for use. Remember that the nomination for offices and the election are prescribed by your club bylaws or standing rules. For further guidance, consult the latest version of Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised.

Go to http://www.gfwc.org/images/gfwc/Leadership%20tips%2012-21-13.pdf for the script to upload as a basic tool to use in either a mock setting for honing skills of the presiding officer and future leaders or to assist in developing the presiding officer's script for a meeting during which officers are elected.
