## **ONCE UPON A TIME**

As a part of the GFWC Ohio President's theme, tidbits from old "The Buckeye" magazines will be shared throughout the administration. "The Buckeye" was once published with the subtitle "Official Organ of the Ohio Federation of Women's Clubs" and had a cover photo of a work of art. Often an essay that could be used as a club program was included. Poetry, "Quotes and Comments", quotations and advertisements filled space. Each district president had an article about the happenings of the clubs in each issue. Each Community Service Program – then known as departments – had several divisions and committees. They were, for instance, "Department of Education", "Division of Adult Education", "Committee on Library Extension", etc. Club building articles were also an important part of "The Buckeye."

One of the first things I came across as I browsed was "The Buckeye for August-September, 1937". Yes, it was a bimonthly publication. Subscriptions were  $50\phi$  per year or  $15\phi$  a copy. In the Division of Conservation it was reported that they were just starting their Federation Forest work. This was a program encouraged for all states by GFWC. They were taking a tract between five and six hundred acres in our Wayne Federal Forest (now Wayne National Forest) area which they expected to reforest, each club planting at least one acre. That is, they were paying for the actual labor. Each acre would receive between 800 and 1000 seedlings. Many clubs planted an acre as a "memorial to each member who had passed on to larger service during the year." The area was to be marked with a rough wooden sign.

In the October-November, 1944 issue, I found the announcement of The Ohio Federation of Women's Clubs Memorial Forest.

"Somewhere in the central part of Ohio a large tract of suitable land is to be selected by the Ohio Division of Forestry, and set aside as a Memorial Forest for those who have made the supreme sacrifice in the present World War.

"Members of the Ohio Federation of Women's Clubs will sponsor this forest by planting a tree for every (continued on page 11)

## Message from the President


## "Once Upon A Time......

Because that's what it's about – when we see a need, we fill it. When someone needs help, we lend a hand. When we work in our communities to make things better for everyone there, we accomplish our goals.

## Thyme to Plant a Time to Grow

A quote which really resonates within me is "Life is not measured by the number of Breath's we take but by the number of Moments that take our breath away". This is one of those moments.

I want to thank-you for this opportunity and for the privilege to serve as Ohio Director of Junior Clubs. As I looked around the room at convention I saw a sea of faces.

Each face tells a story: so many faces so many stories. You come from many different backgrounds and many different clubs across the state. You have many different life experiences and yet you all have at least one thing in common, your willingness to give your time to help others. I am humbled by your generosity of spirit and your compassion for your fellow human beings. Many of these words were used by Wendy Moore on her blog to thank volunteers during national volunteer week. These words describe all of you who so generously give your time throughout the year to Ohio Federation of Women's Clubs.



Thanks to all of you, our mission goes on. It is all of you, working so hard to make our communities a better place, who take my breath away. Thank you all for Volunteering and being a part of GFWC/OFWC.

I would like to thank the Northeast District for all of their support and to my club Boardman Poland Jr. Women's League. I also want to say thank-you to the 2014-2016 Junior Board who said yes when they were asked to volunteer. We have a wonderful group of Women and I am looking forward to working with them.

This is an exciting time for the General Federation of Women's Clubs. I believe in the tradition, continuity and mission of the Ohio Juniors.

The Junior Theme is "Thyme to Plant, A Time to Grow". The focus for this Administration will be on conservation, gardening and improving our communities.

In 2002 I joined two clubs, Boardman Poland Junior Women's League and Holborn Herb Growers Guild. Both of these clubs have become a huge part of my life. When I started to think about my theme and my pin I knew I had to incorporate both of these two clubs. My pin is round to symbolize "the circle of life". The thyme around the edges symbolizes Activity, Courage, Strength and Happiness; feelings that club work brings to all Club Women. The butterflies represent Freedom, Fun and Joyous times; they are a reminder to make changes when opportunity arises. The watering can with the GFWC logo symbolizes water, the "source of life"; as all club women are the "source of life" for GFWC. The tools surrounding the watering can symbolize all clubwomen; the tools needed to support GFWC.

The Focus for this Administration will be on Conservation, Gardening and improving our Communities. Gardening enhances our quality of life in numerous ways: providing fresh food, exercise, health benefits and life-long learning. It creates pleasing landscapes, improves the environment and brings people together. Garden-based learning programs result in increased nutrition and environmental awareness. It gives young people the chance to develop a wide range of academic and social skills. Garden experiences

- Enhance an awareness of the link between plants in the landscape and our clothing, food, shelter and well-being.
- Provides children and youth with the time and space to explore the natural world—something that can occur rarely in today's era.

## So, what can we do? You can take "thyme" to plant time to grow.

Initiate a successful community gardening project with kids. Demonstrate how plants are grown from seed and let them take the fresh vegetables home. Many children have no idea how the produce ends up in their neighborhood grocery stores. Plant an indoor Garden in a nursing home or for a shut in.

<u>Start and Sustain a School Garden</u>: Discusses seed saving, how to "go native," how to compost and use compost. Recent findings include improved concentration for children with attention deficit disorders after taking a walk in the park and may lower crime rates in inner-city neighborhoods that have greenery.

Start a Community garden: Raise vegetables to be donated to homeless shelters, Veterans' clinics, or food pantries.

<u>Plant a cutting Garden:</u> Cut and take arrangements to nursing homes, hospitals or churches to brighten someone's day.

<u>Plant a Butterfly Garden:</u> Include Milkweed for the Monarch Butterflies. Monarch Butterflies are in danger of becoming extinct.

Plant a Garden of Hope for Cancer Survivors: To quote Lady Bird Johnson, "Where flowers bloom, so does hope".

The ideas for gardens are endless and I'm sure that you will come up with something that fits for your club. I realize that all of you do not want to get your hands dirty, so you can be in the planning or distribution of the bounty or beauty of your gardens. And when it comes time to do our annual club report, we will be looking for the club that has the most creative community improvement, conservation or teaching experience. The Junior Special Project "The Circle of Life" Award will be given to the club or clubs who have created a garden and used the bounty from it to improve their community.

In closing I would like to thank you all for sharing your precious time with me. Thank you to everyone who worked so hard to make the 2014 Convention a wonderful success. I look forward to visiting your clubs across the state and spending more "Thyme" with you! I would like to express my immense gratitude to OFWC and all of you for giving me this privilege to become OFWC Director of Juniors.

Now you know why it is called the Memorial Forest. Obviously this project grew into the Forest and Shrine and continues to receive our care to this day.



The meeting facility is located in the Retirement Village called Enchanted Acres.


