

The Wounded Veterans Initiative

The goal of the President's Special Emphasis is to raise awareness of The Wounded Veterans Initiative, and to raise funds to help the project.

An assistance dog can provide the help veterans need to regain independence. Now through The Wounded Veterans Initiative, Canine Companions for Independence provides assistance dogs to veterans with physical disabilities resulting from military service. The dogs are free to veterans.

One way your club can support this project is to participate in "Quarters for Canines". Each time your club gathers for a meeting, circulate a container to collect all of the quarters that the members have in their purses. Or plan an activity in your community for dogs, and collect donations for CCI. When you collect these funds, send them to OFWC Treasurer Carolyn Adams. She will keep a running total of donations and at the end of the Administration, these funds will be presented to The Wounded Veterans Initiative. \$84.25 was collected at State Information Day. The total collected so far is \$471.25.

Legislation, Public Policy and Resolutions

Since the first board meeting in 1895, GFWC Ohio has been active in campaigning for change. Those first standing committee were to investigate and report on public schools, philanthropy and reform, sanitary and domestic science, parks and beautifying cities, good roads, village and county libraries and clubs, police matrons, cigarette smoking, and social hygiene and the age of consent. GFWC Ohio still continues with those concerns but has achieved so much in the years that have followed. We are not so different from those first club leaders, but we have many more tools at our disposal with electronic mail, social media and a virtual library at our fingertips via the web. The committee encourages members to learn about the political process, policy issues and pending legislation, and further, to act upon that knowledge to further the goals of the organization as outlined in our resolutions and policy priorities.

The first resolutions committee was appointed at the first annual convention. The resolutions state the policies of GFWC Ohio as voted upon by our convention representatives. Only with a resolution can the Federation advocate for or against an issue. Resolutions can be used as tools even at the local level. If a particular subject is not addressed by a resolution, members cannot use GFWC or GFWC Ohio's support to advocate for or against the issue. Members may advocate as concerned individuals, however. When a club desires to support or fight an issue, please look at both the GFWC Ohio and GFWC resolutions. If it is not on the books at one of those levels, the organization cannot support the club's activities on the issue. Please refer to the GFWC Club Manual and the GFWC Ohio Directory for resources and instructions on legislation, public policy and resolutions. Resolutions for both organizations may also be found online at their respective websites. And please, sign up to receive notices from the Legislative Action Center at www.gfwc.org found under the public policy tab.

GFWC Belpre Woman's Club has a long history of assisting EVE, Inc., the Domestic Violence Shelter of Washington County, in nearby Marietta, Ohio. Our assistance continued in 2014, beginning during the term of President Beatrice Corra, and continuing with the current President Judy Drake.

The strategy of giving changed and was modeled after a club project shared in an after-lunch break at the GFWC Ohio Annual Convention by Ohio's Assistant Director of Junior Clubs, Deidre Devore. Her small club of 8 active members made a difference to their local food pantry with each of the club's members bringing the same food item to their monthly club meeting. This resulted in a significant donation to the pantry.

With GFWC Belpre Woman's Club's 25-member increase in 2014, this strategy was very successful. Each month September through May, club members donated paper towels, boxed cereal, boxed macaroni & cheese, canned fruit, tissues, toilet tissue, laundry detergent, and Zip-loc bags, respectively. Belpre Club women are very generous and in appreciation for our donations to EVE, Inc., we received the 2014 Friend of EVE Award, "In grateful recognition of their generous donations supporting survivors and their children"

Founded in 1984, the Women's History and Resource Center collects, preserves, interprets, and promotes the history of GFWC and women volunteers. The WHRC documents the social and political contributions of GFWC clubwomen from 1890 to the present through the GFWC archives, related special collections and publications. Highlights of GFWC Ohio Federation WHRC actions plans are:

- Clubs should appoint a WHRC chairman or committee
- Utilize the tools available thru the Women's History and Resource Center in developing program(s) to educate and inspire members and potential members.
- Report WHRC program activities to GFWC and the Oho Federation.
- Clubs should update their club history every two years and inform WHRC of the location of your club records.
- Clubs and members are encouraged to join the Friends of WHRC.
- Participate in the Clubwoman Essay Contest "A Woman Who Has Inspired Me".
