- a. Empire or an area of many territories and people that is controlled by one government
- b. Rulers of empires gained great wealth from trade and agriculture
- c. Babylon was the capital of the Babylonian Empire
- d. Babylonians built roads
- e. Caravans are groups of travelers
- f. Bazaars are markets
- g. Trade makes Babylon rich

B. The Empire of the Assyrians

- a. Assyria is on open land making it easy for invasion
- b. Assyria stretches from the Nile River to the Persian Gulf

1. Assyria's Contributions

- a. They invented battering rams
- b. Assyrian capital Nineveh becomes a city of great learning
- c. They recorded on tablets about early Mesopotamia which we can study from

2. Assyria Overthrown

a. Medes and Chaldeans joined together to overtake the Assyrians in 612 BC

C. Babylonia Rises Again

- a. Under Chaldeans Babylon rises to an even greater splendor
- b. New Babylonia Empire controlled all of the Fertile Crescent
- 1. Nebuchadnezzar, King of Babylon
 - a. King Nebuchadnezzar II rebuilt the city of Babylon which had been destroyed by the Assyrians
 - b. He built the Hanging Gardens of Babylon
