

Linda Ross, Convention Chairman and Lin Wilken, Northwest District General Arrangements Chairman both did an outstanding job coordinating this year's activities, workshops, meetings and banquets! Thanks to all of the volunteer club members who also played such an important part in carrying out such a very successful and enjoyable Convention. Special thanks as well to GFWC President-elect Mary Ellen Laister for all of her wonderful contributions to our weekend. It was such a pleasure and honor to have her with us! Kudos and thanks to Joan Gordon and Lin Wilken, our retiring Buckeye Magazine and Directory editors. And lastly, to our outgoing leaders, President Evelyn Bachman and Director of Junior Clubs Lisa Hedrick; we want you both to know how much we appreciate your excellent leadership and your commitment to the GFWC/Ohio Federation of Women's Clubs. You both have set an outstanding example for us all!

The theme for the 2012-2014 Administration is: "One person.....One chance.....Just Do One Thing!" I have been thinking about this Administration theme for a very long time.....beginning with the "green" crystal bracelet that my husband gave me as a gift a few years ago. It has a tiny footprint charm on it....which symbolizes not only the carbon footprint that we all leave upon this planet but also the first step on the journey to make a personal change. As part of the process of defining the 2012-2014 Administration theme, I was next impressed by GFWC Secretary Mary Ellen Brock's speech "The Power of One" that she presented at our GFWC/Ohio Convention in 2011. As these ideas began to come together, it was exciting to think that if each person would just make one sustainable, positive change in their life, then each one of us, either singly or by working within a group, could create great changes in our world, our society, our environment and also in ourselves. I also believe that this idea of just doing one thing can include and involve many of our club members who are no longer able to attend club meetings or participate in club programs or projects. Every club member is included and can be a part of this initiative!

This little "dot" is called an **emoticon** 😊They are used in emails and texts to show the emotions of the writer. I call this a "MI-DOT" and that stands for: **My Initiative.....Do One Thing!** This "**MI-DOT**" reminds us of the commitment we make to change just one thing in our life. Your change should be something that makes you happy to do... make it repeatable, make it sustainable and make it enjoyable!

You may make your change by yourself....or with your club, or with your family, or with your community....but I challenge each one of you as one person.....to take this one chance....and Just Do One Thing. The outcomes of changes such as these can have a dramatic effect when multiplied by so many. Mary Mackzum


