I can hear you say, "WHAT????"



Go to <u>www.firefox.com</u> and download the new browser on your computer. It is free, fast, and easy to get. Bracelets distributed at Teen Summit for the Signature Project Domestic Violence Awareness and Prevention By Lisa Waitkus

Club members all over Ohio have been working on purple braided T-Shirt bracelets for our State Signature Project – Domestic Violence Awareness and Prevention. These bracelets were attached to purple bookmarks containing Teen Dating Violence facts, the Love is Respect website, and GFWC Ohio information. The website contains information about Teen Dating Violence and Quizzes that teens can take to see if their relationship is "healthy" or not. The bracelets were tied to the bookmarks with purple ribbons and distributed to over 250 youth who attended the Youth Advisory Committee of Cuyahoga County's 4th Annual Youth Summit at Cleveland State University on Saturday April 20,2013.

The youth attended sessions from the Domestic Violence and Child Advocacy Center, Diversity Center of Northeast Ohio, Poison/ Injury Prevention Center from Rainbow Babies and Children's Hospital, and Bellefaire's Homeless Youth Programs, just to name a few. The sessions were presented by a collaboration of these professionals, and youth leaders of the Youth Advisory Committee of Cuyahoga County.

Robin Stone, program coordinator of 4-H Youth Development – Ohio State University Extension, worked with us to include us in their program and to enable us to reach over 250 youth with this important information. Corky Nosek – GFWC Ohio President, and Lisa Waitkus – GFWC Ohio Signature Project Co-Chair both spoke briefly about the project and GFWC during their opening ceremonies. During the summit, Marie Barni, County Director – Ohio State University Extension told us "the bracelets and bookmarks are the hottest thing at the summit". It was inspiring to be able to get this important information out to so many youth at one time. This would not have been possible without the help of so many clubs and clubwomen across Ohio making these bracelets at their club meetings, workshops, and Fall Conferences. What a great team effort GFWC Ohio!!

2012 CLUBWOMAN'S ESSAY "CHANGE IS WITHIN ME" by Chandra Berry

If you had asked me in 1983 I would have said "It's boring". If you had asked me in 1987, I would have said "Why bother". If you had asked me in 1997, I would have said "I'm too busy" and in 2001, "Maybe in a few years". At these pivotal times in my life I had lots of excuses, but the truth is I just didn't want to be bothered. However, in 2002, everything changed. The change was sudden and visible and painful. Everything changed on the outside but the biggest change was on the inside. The biggest change was within me.

So many people go through changes in their lives. Some people use life changes as a reason to set new goals and some people use them as a reason to curl up and withdraw from the world. For me it was different. My life change came unexpectedly at age thirty-seven when I was on top of the world: a husband, a 16 month old baby, my dream home becoming a reality, healthy supportive parents and a job that I loved. My life change set me on a course for spiritual learning, seeking a relationship with God that I had never had before. It set in motion a personal journey that only benefitted, me and yet was the most unselfish act I have ever done. This is my story of the change within me.

I was a high school librarian; only five years into my dream job after the long educational process of earning my Master's Degree. I had a few extra days at the end of the school year for inventory and other clerical duties. On a rainy Thursday afternoon there was only one more day until summer vacation began and my little family would be moving into our new home. I had every-thing I had ever wanted. The kind of life my husband and I referred to as "the white picket fence". I left the school a little early that day because everyone else had already gone. As I was driving the rural road towards home, a young sixteen year old inexperienced driver made a poor decision that would forever alter my life. He was a good kid, an avid reader who visited me every day in my library, who simply made a bad choice in a split second. The last thing I remember was the crunching sound of my SUV as it crumpled during the collision, flipping and rolling down the road. In my mind, for just an instant, I can remember thinking that I just did-n't have time for this. Little did I know that my time here on earth was very close to an end.

Days led into weeks which led into months of hospitalization, rehabilitation and therapy. Injuries that should have ended my life left me with visible scars, spinal curvature, internal damage to arteries and nerves and paralysis in my right shoulder and arm. Luckily I had a strong supportive family who stepped in to care for my son and a husband who was determined that I would come home to our new house, unpacked and ready to live in. As I reflect back on the first two years of my "new normal:, I wonder how I made it through, and yet at the same time, I see there was never any question about it.

I remember lying in bed one night with my toddler son sleeping next to me, thinking "I don't think I can endure this pain any longer. How can I live with this and take care of a baby that I can't even pick up?" I remember crying quietly so as not to wake him up and asking Jesus to help me. Just in that moment my son rolled over onto my chest and I felt the most serene sense of calm wash over me. In that one simple divine moment I knew it was all going to be okay. Not easy, but somehow, with God's strength behind me, it would be okay.

Today, ten years later, I continue to strive for a close relationship with God. There are times when homework, illnesses, finances, housework and other mundane worries take over my life and I begin to feel frazzled. I wonder how things can be so stress-ful and out of control. I cry and kick and scream like a child who has lost his favorite toy, and then I step back and realize I have become disconnected from God again. This relationship, like any marriage or family relationship, takes commitment, time and often blind faith. It's forever changing, growing and evolving into something bigger and better and more wonderful. Something new within me that won't change the world, but forever changed my life.

MOHICAN-MEMORIAL FOREST AND SHRINE RECEIVE CONTRIBUTION FROM COLUMBIA PIPELINE GROUP



The Mohican-Memorial Forest and the Ohio Federation of Women's Clubs have received a contribution of \$25,000 from Columbia Pipeline Group (CPG). The funds will benefit the Memorial Forest Shrine and the horseman's group camp area, which are located in Mohican-Memorial State Forest.

"We are appreciative of Columbia Pipeline Group's contribution to the Ohio Federation of Women's Clubs and to the Mohican-Memorial Forest," said Robert Boyles, chief of the ODNR Division of Forestry.

"This contribution will help improve and maintain this historic memorial in a manner befitting the names of the men and women it honors." CPG's \$25,000 contribution was made through the charitable foundation of its parent company, NiSource. The Women's Clubs will use a majority of the funds for the Memorial Forest Shrine, and the remainder will be designated for improvements to the horseman's group camp area, which will be coordinated by the Wayne County Chapter of the Ohio Horseman's Council.

Some of the plans for the contribution include replacing the flag pole, repairing the sandstone walkways, continuing the memorial brick walkway project and installing a concrete pad at the horseman's group camp area shelter building.

The Memorial Forest Shrine is dedicated to the memory of 20,000 Ohioans that died in World War II, the Korean War, the Vietnam War and the Persian Gulf War.

The meeting facility is located in the Retirement Village called Enchanted Acres.



Take Rathmell Rd. to the first traffic light and turn left (north) onto Parsons Ave.

Go about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile to a brick entrance into Enchanted Acres. The meeting facility is their Community Center and is fairly new and in the middle of the park.

From Cincinnati area: on I-71 go north to the 270 by-pass near the Grove City area, Exit #101. Go east toward Wheeling to Exit #52 – the sign reads Rt. 23 South, Circleville. Take Rt. 23 South, (High Street) then follow directions above.

Enchanted Acres Community Center is located about 1/2 mile north of Rathmell Rd. on Parsons Ave. See map below.
