## Past State President and Buckeye Editor, Joan Gordon, passes away

Joan Lois Honkala Gordon, 78, of Bowling Green, a former executive director of the Bowling Green Chamber of Commerce, who served on the Wood County Committee on Aging and orchestrated projects throughout Wood County, died of liver cancer in Bridge Hospice at Heritage Corners.

From the time Mrs. Gordon began working in 1958 at a library in Elyria, Ohio, her eye for organization and detail was put to use. "She never made a mistake, and when the director came to check her work it was perfect. She had an eagle eye for correcting things," her husband said.

Born Jan. 29, 1935, in Painesville, Ohio, she and her husband met at Bowling Green State University in 1956. They worked on the university newspaper, she as a reporter, and he as a photographer. They married in 1957.

A brief stint in Elyria was followed by a move to Columbus, where she received a bachelor's degree in education from Ohio State University.

In 1959, Mr. Gordon was offered a job at Bowling Green State University as director of news and photography services. After teaching English and journalism at Bowling Green High School for two years, she took a break to rear their two children.

In 1968, she became a radio and TV editor for the Sentinel-Tribune, followed by public information director at WBGU-TV from 1972 to 1984. (continued on page 9)

The GFWC Sock Project was a very successful project that brought clubs working together on one project. I believe that we might be able to generate the same type of awareness in the area of "Advocates for Children" with a similar project.

Members will be asked to work with any organization that services children such as domestic violence shelters, family emergency shelters, juvenile detention centers, day cares, homeless shelters, and others. The project would be called the GFWC Pillowcase Project with the title of "Sweet Dreams-May All Your Dreams Come True". The project will provide a child with a "special" pillowcase that they can keep and call their own. It can provide comfort, a sense of ownership and bring a smile to their face and a gift that would brighten their day. Club members may make the pillowcase, using bright colors and kid friendly prints or they can embellish store bought pillowcase with ribbon or other decorations or purchase pillowcases with colorful print. I have attached a copy of some pillowcases that were made by my fellow club members. Clubs can also "fill" the pillow cases for special occasions with toiletries, socks, pajamas and can be used for emergency first night kits for children.

"Then she was lured away, in 1984, and hired as executive director of the Bowling Green Area Chamber of Commerce," Mr. Gordon said. She retired in 1999. In that position, Mrs. Gordon made the proper connections to get things done in town. "She was always on top of the situation and trying to move the agenda forward," Mayor Richard Edwards said.

One of the changes she made was to the yearly lighting of the Christmas tree in front of the public library. She helped raise funds for the July 4th fireworks display.

Her aptitude for ideas, organizing, and keeping projects moving led to the formation of Leadership BG. Part of the chamber's project was to facilitate introductions, mostly university administrators, to bank employees, city, state, and county officials.

The group learned how to network, a tool that Mrs. Gordon found useful in obtaining money for a new kitchen to serve meals to the city's senior citizens.

Denise Niese, executive director for the Wood County Committee on Aging, said Mrs. Gordon, who served as president in 2004 and co-president in 2011, mentored her in her new position, and introduced Mrs. Niese to the community by engaging her in civic projects.

She also was instrumental in securing state funds for a kitchen in 2006 that serves food to the seven senior centers throughout Wood County.

She facilitated discussions with state representatives that resulted in \$500,000 for the kitchen in the 2004-05 Ohio budget, Mrs. Niese said. She raised the rest of the money through private donors and bequests. Today, the kitchen serves more than 800 meals a day.

She was active in the Woman's Club of Bowling Green, Bowling Green Kiwanis, League of Women Voters Bowling Green and she organized the city's 175th anniversary party in 2003.

"You could go through the community in Bowling Green and see a Joan Gordon thumbprint on it," Mayor Edwards said. "She is almost irreplaceable."

She is survived by her husband James, son Kevin, daughter Melissa Gordon-Johnson, brother Richard Honkala, and three grandchildren.

"Our dear friend and GFWC Ohio Past President, Joan Gordon, passed away on September 1, 2013. Joan was a remarkable club woman, community citizen, businesswoman and special friend. How lucky we all were to have shared the weekend of the GFWC Ohio Convention in April with her. She has left an enduring legacy to the GFWC/Ohio Federation of Women's Clubs for which we are forever grateful. Whenever we see a rainbow, let us all think of our friend Joan Gordon." Corky Nosek, OFWC President reported to the Ohio membership. Joan left a remarkable legacy for all of us to treasure and strive to live up to.
